Excludina: Sharks, rays, turtles, balloon fishes, eels, and all out of season fishes.

INVASIVE SPECIES: Roi, To'au & Ta'ape (all paid participants are automatically entered). Most fish, not total weight.

WEIGH-IN SITE INFORMATION:

- 1. All fish will be weighed in at the Honoka'a Sports Complex P&R Gym.
- 2. The weigh-in time is from 12 p.m. to 1:30 p.m., Sunday, August 18, 2024. Entrants must be in line at the a. weigh-in no later than 1:30 p.m. to qualify their fish. The tournament weigh master's watch shall determine the end of the weigh-in time.
- 2. Absolutely no alcoholic beverages will be allowed on the premises. The "2024 P&R OHANA SHORELINE FISHING TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE" will not be responsible for theft, fire, or loss of any property during this tournament or at the weigh-in site.

WEIGH-IN MEASUREMENT: All fish will be weighed on the state certified scale at the weigh-in site. If any two fish are in dispute due to identical weight, the determining factor shall be the earlier time a fish was weighed in shall determine the winner. All weights and times are final as deemed by the tournament weigh-in committee.

PROTESTS AND DISPUTES: All protests and disputes as to the interpretation of these rules and regulations or applications shall be decided on by the committee members.
